The students watched role plays, asked questions and participated in games. We attended the sessions with Yackandandah and Kiewa Valley Primary Schools which provided a great opportunity for the students to interact with other peers in their same grade level. WALK TO SCHOOL MONTH: This month Osbornes Flat is joining in a statewide initiative "Walk to school Month." This event aims to increase the amount of activity the students do daily and encourages them to be fitter and healthier. If students walk or ride to school, or complete laps of the oval upon arrival at school, they receive a tick/s on the class chart. The student across the Indigo Shire with the highest percentage of ticks will receive a free family fitness event. In addition to this, next Thursday we will be holding a free healthy breakfast for the students as they arrive at school.

BUSHFIRE RELOCATION: As we are heading into the fire season it is important to note that we are on the Bushfire At Risk Register. We are classified as a Category 2 school which means that we will be closed on a Code Red Day. If it is forecast to be an Extreme fire day we will relocate to Yackandandah Primary School. On the day prior to an extreme day we will notify families via email, on School Stream and on the Facebook page. We will also be trialing a text messaging system and in the next few weeks we will conduct a test message.
